Proposed Impact of Sport Premium Grant 2022-23

Improved outdoor area environment for Elm and Willow class (EYFS and KS1) to promote gross motor skill development -Large sandpit, gravel for tyres

Children have developed gross motor skills using these resources. It is a very popular area of provision and the has also led to the children developing team work collaboration and communication skills.

Attendance at competitive sports tournaments for the whole school.

Unfortunately this hasn't happened to the extent that had been planned due to the lack of a HLTA to work on a Friday. Never the less all KS2 children have been out at least twice, some children more to a variety of different events. All year 2 and most of year 1 have also been out. Reception have not accessed a sports tournament

Updated equipment to ensure PE lessons are taught to a high standard and lack of equipment is not barrier to teaching

Equipment has been replenished and shed has been kept tidy thanks to Mr Wainwright. Teachers have access for resources as and when they have needed them. Tennis balls and beanbags have been completely re stocked.

Providing a wealth of opportunities for children to try a range of activities to find the activity for them. Subsidising coach costs so transport is not a barrier to attendance.

All 3 and 4 attended Hever castle triathlon. A great opportunity to swim cycle and run. A very well organised event. Hever castle was offered to all 5 and 6 although uptake was only 50% which was disappointing. All KS2 taken to district cross country.

Increase knowledge of health and safety in PE and sport across all staff

PE lead attended course and then filtered information down through staff meeting. Learning walk showed that staff are confident in making decisions that keep children safe whilst participating in PE and sport.

Before lockdown every child had represented the school at least once and the children asked when it would be their turn. There is a buzz about being selected to represent their school and they enjoy the spectacle of achievement assembly. The school was nominated for and won Northamptonshire Sport Primary Sport school of the Year due to its commitment to inclusivity and participation

Increase participation in physical activity through lunch time support, specifically targeting Change 4 life children.

Pacesetter provide lunch time support, targeting specific children for behaviour. Sports leaders engage the younger children in personal challenges to keep lunch times active.

Upper body strength developed, particularly for EYFS and KS1 children, through installation of large play equipment – Help with body tone, co-ordination, impact on handwriting skills

Equipment installed – Providing a good level of challenge for the children. Ensure a rota is maintained to make sure that all children are given equal access to the Equipment.

Equipment is replaced and maintained. New equipment is purchased to enable children to access a full variety of activities, particularly inclusive sport activities
